Understanding church buildings

'How to 'Read' a Church' is a Google story enabling students to learn about the history and typical furnishings of the English parish church.

Students can use the gallery to identify symbols of the Trinity, the Resurrection and Mary, explain their ideas and perhaps carry out further research.
