

## How we got here

All Souls, Bolton opened in December 2014 revealing the results of an ambitious scheme which had been ten years in the making. Through a partnership between The Churches Conservation Trust and the local community, and with support from a variety of funders, this Grade II\* listed church was restored to its role at the heart of Bolton life.

With a cafe, event and office space, All Souls is an award winning, 21st-century community space for people of all faiths and none.

### Our achievements so far

All Souls has been open for two years. These are a few facts and figures on our work to date:

- £4.9m investment into Bolton
- Multiple-award winner:
  - Historic England's Heritage Angel Award (2015)
  - RICS Project of the Year (North West) (2015)
  - RICS Building Conservation Award (2015)
  - RICS Community Benefit Award (2015)
  - Civic Voice Design Award (2015)
- 6 jobs created
- 11 work placements provided in 2015/16
- 3 people found jobs as a result of our work placement programme
- 3 people who started in work placements stayed on as volunteers, working towards a diploma in customer service
- All Souls helped generate over 300 volunteer days, welcoming 18 new volunteers
- 750 visitors welcomed to All Souls each month
- All Souls has been a venue for over 400 events
- 4 tenants based at All Souls, delivering a range of services to the local community
- Over £3000 raised for other local charities through fundraising activities at All Souls
